Mike Bach brings us a video about the building of the Eimac 4-1000 RF power vacuum tube. This tube was a favorite for both commercial and amateur radio operators in the 1950's and 1960's.

Digression

The 4-1000A could be operated at 6 kilovolts DC plate voltage in pulse mode, but was a semi-stable oscillator with a bit too much gain at that voltage into a tuned load.

A pair of these tubes could easily make legal amateur power levels. Several times folks were able to hear Around-the-Earth echos (1/7 of a second delay) during the great HF band conditions of yester year.

1. Eimac	4-100	00 Tube

Program: We will have an approximately 30 min video program about the building of a Eimac 4-1000 tube. In December 1953 KGO TV (channel-7) in the SF Bay Area had a monthly program called "Success Story". KGO sent a Camera crew to Eimac and filmed the process of the assembly. The Eimac Rep who told the story was John Reinartz, K6BJ (formerly 1QP, 1XAM & W3RB) the inventor of the "Reinartz Coupler", also Chief of Communications of the 1925 Byrd North Pole expedition (Art Collins 9CXX as a young man was one of the few Hams who could maintain daily contact with this expedition when the Commercial stations could not).

2023 Amateur Radio Examinations

In the Rogue Valley, amateur radio exams are provided by the RVARC and the SOARC. New exam participants need to provide identification, while upgrading amateurs need to provide a copy of their current license as well as show photo identification. Applicants also need a Federal Registration Number (FRN) and email prior to taking the test. The exam fee for 2023 probably remains \$15.00. All license candidates must provide a picture ID.
